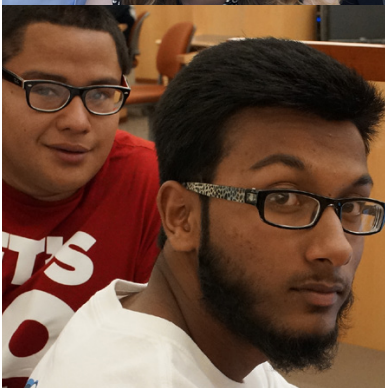
Each session is devoted to the study of extraordinary leaders across the various sectors of leadership: civic, business, politics, sports, etc.
