Dear Political Science Faculty and faculty in related disciplines,

Please forward this message to all interested faculty.

I am contacting you today from the Course Identification System (C-ID) because C-ID is seeking faculty members interested in participating as Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) members.

FDRGs, as senate-appointed discipline faculty, play an important role in the development and review of statewide model curriculum. The FDRG members are responsible for drafting and reviewing feedback on the curricula and actively work to finalize the draft materials developed for their disciplines. FDRGs are also assembled to discuss, develop, review, and revise course descriptors for C-ID. Each discipline group is comprised of faculty from the community college and CSU systems. Since C-ID is predicated on faculty-to-faculty dialogue, each FDRG is facilitated by a lead discipline faculty member, or FDRG Lead, to carry out the tasks described in greater detail below. Members of the FDRG are responsible for a variety of tasks including:

1. Identification of those courses which are common major components

in their field. The FDRGs must determine which courses within the discipline need descriptors and a C-ID number.

2. Assignment of a supranumber to those prioritized courses based on the C-ID numbering protocol.

3. Development (or review) and approval of C-ID descriptors for those numbered courses. Individual lower division courses awarded a C-ID number will reflect the published descriptor and will further assure institutions that students successful in those classes should be well-prepared for upper-division work or, in the case of local degrees and certificates, are career-ready.
