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Course Applicability

Not Degree Applicable (NDA) - Course can not be used towards any credit program (associate degrees or certificates of achievement)

- All noncredit courses and some credit courses (LS M02, M02L)
 - Noncredit courses can be part of a Certificate of Completion or Certificate of Competency

Associate Applicable (AA) - Apply to credit programs (associate degrees and/or certificates)

Locally determined.

Program Applicable - Part of a program (AA/AS, COA, MC GE, Cal-GETC)

Stand-Alone – Not part of any local programs

California State University (CSU) Transfer Courses

- Transferability is locally determined via <u>CSU EO 167</u>
 - > CSU Considerations in Determining Baccalaureate Course
- Courses are added to <u>ASSIST</u> by the AO after CCCO/COCI approval
 - No formal submission
- Coursework and units are accepted for general credit to the CSU system and apply to the bachelor's degree
- CSU-approved courses can apply to credit programs (associate degrees and/or COA)
- No longer available for CSU GE submission

Course Submission for UC Transfer

New Course - Must meet one of the following criteria

- > Should be comparable to one offered at the lower-division level at a UC campus.
- If not equivalent to a particular UC course, it must be appropriate for a university degree in terms of purpose, scope, and depth.
- ➢ Guidelines for Subject Areas

Substantial Change

- > Prerequisites
- Course content, Course objective/learning objectives
- Decrease in contact hours and/or units
- Cross-listing (not recommended)
- Mode of delivery (only if student learning objectives or content are affected)

Submission Timeline

- Mid-June of each year
- Results expected in July/Aug.

UC Approved Courses

- Listed on the UC Transferable Course List (UCTCA) and published in <u>ASSIST</u>
- Courses and units are accepted for general credit to the UC system (60 semester units)
- Can be proposed for Cal-GETC consideration, if appropriate
- Major Requirement (course-to-course). Campus specific
- Can be used to meet CSU transfer and local credit programs (associate degrees and COAs).

Denied Courses

COR can be revised and resubmit during the next review cycle

Submission of Cal-GETC

(California General Education Transfer Curriculum)

Cal-GETC

Must be approved for UC transfer PRIOR to Cal-GETC submission

Must meet the current <u>Cal-GETC Standards</u> for requesting Area

Timeline

- Submission deadline: Mid-December of each year
- Result: April through May of the following year
 - ✤ If approved, can be offered for Fall of the same year
 - ✤ No retroactive or summer approval.

Program and Transfer Requirements

Associate Degree Requirements

Associate in Arts and Associate in Science Degrees

- > 60 semester units of associate degree applicable
 - * Include Associate degree, CSU and UC transferable courses
 - General Education (GE)
 - Catalog rights prior to Fall 2025: VCCCD (28 units), CSU GE (39), or IGETC (37) Pattern
 - Catalog rights of Fall 2025 or thereafter: New VCCCD (24) or Cal-GETC (34) Pattern
 - Catalog Rights VCCCD: The graduation requirements that are in place at the time the student began taking courses at MC or another college/university with regional or institutional accreditation.
 - Catalog rights and Continuous Enrollment {enrolled in at least 1 term (S, SS, F, or W)}
 Can choose to follow the graduation requirements at the time they started or any time thereafter.
 - > Major or Area of Emphasis (General Studies degrees)
 - > Elective units, if needed to reach 60 semester units.

CSU Upper-Division Transfer Requirements

- > 60 semester units of CSU transferable college credit.
- GPA of 2.0 (CSU transferable units)
- General Education (GE)
 - CSU GE or IGETC Pattern: Catalog rights prior to F2025
 - Cal-GETC: Catalog rights of F2025 or after
 - Catalog rights include enrollment at CSU or CCC, but not at UC or private or out-of-state institutions or high school dual enrollment
- > Major refer to <u>ASSIST</u>.
 - Articulation agreements with all 23 CSU campuses but not every major available.
 - Approval of courses for major and updating of ASSIST agreements is dependent on the CSU and their process.
- Elective units, if needed to reach 60 CSU transferable units.

UC Transfer Requirements

- > 60 semester units of UC transferable college credit
- ➢ Min GPA of 2.4 (UC transferable units).
- General Education (GE)
 - IGETC: Catalog rights of before Fall 2025
 - Cal-GETC: Catalog rights of Fall 2025 or after
 - Catalog rights no systemwide policy. For now, follows CCC policy
- Major refer to ASSIST
 - Articulation agreements with all 9 UC campuses, but not every major available
- > Elective units, if needed to reach 60 UC transferable units.
